CAMP LOCATION

Camp Koinonia takes place at Hensel Christian Youth Camp. Hensel Camp is located on Singleton Bend Rd (just off of FM 1431, about 27 miles west of I-35). The location on Google Maps can be found on the Camp K website (<https://www.camp-k.org>).

PLEASE NOTE: It is your responsibility to arrange for your camper's transportation to & from camp.

TIMES TO REMEMBER

Please note and pay attention to the dates and times that are specific to each session. Details regarding the check-in and check-out times of your camper's session will also be emailed to you.

SENIOR SESSION – ARRIVAL (CAMPER CHECK-IN & DROP-OFF)

Check-in is from 10:30am-11:45am on Sunday, June 28. Lunch will begin at noon. We ask that all parents have left the camp grounds by this time.

SENIOR SESSION – CHECK OUT DAY (CAMPER PICK-UP)

Pick-up is 3:30pm-4:15pm on Tuesday, June 30. Make efforts to be here on time, but don't arrive early.

JUNIOR SESSION – ARRIVAL (CAMPER CHECK-IN & DROP-OFF)

Check-in is from 10:00am-11:45am on Thursday, July 2. Lunch will begin at noon. We ask that all parents have left the camp grounds by this time.

JUNIOR SESSION – CHECK OUT DAY (CAMPER PICK-UP)

Pick-up is 3:30pm-4:15pm on Saturday, July 4. Make efforts to be here on time, but don't arrive early.

The Check-in location will be emailed to you. Please read the following so you understand what will happen during that time.

- Proceed to the check-in location.
- Campers will pick up a lanyard and a packet.
- **ALL** campers & parents **MUST** talk to the Medical Staff.
- All camper medicine (prescription and over-the-counter) must be turned in to our Medical Staff. See "Medications" section on page 5.
- Those with special dietary needs will meet with Kitchen Staff during check-in.
- Any outstanding payments or issues need to be settled with our Camp Secretary, Jane Anne Cox.
- As the last step, parents/guardians will receive a handout with information.
- Then, parents will drive their camper to their cabin, unload their stuff, & meet the Cabin Counselors.
- Campers are not allowed to have their cellphones or car keys during Camp. We recommend campers give these things to their parents before leaving. Otherwise, these items must be given to the Counselors.
- Lunch will begin at 12pm and we ask that all parents leave by this time. If, somehow, your child is not completely settled in their cabin, our staff will assist in the final adjustments. We appreciate your cooperation with this!

WHEN YOU ARRIVE

Here are just a few of the activities that take place each day at camp!

DAILY ACTIVITIES @ CAMP

MORNING WORSHIP

After breakfast, we meet in the amphitheater for worship and to hear more about the focus of the day.

GROUP BIBLE CLASS

Our classes meet each day to study the Bible and discuss the day's particular focus.

ALL-CAMP ACTIVITY

A game or activity that the entire camp participates in. Some examples are Capture the Flag, Kamikaze Kickball, or various cabin challenges.

GAME TIME

Fun, competitive games played together that help build comradery and cohesiveness among the groups and grade levels.

JOURNEY/BIG GROUPS

Small discussion groups that meet throughout our time to process what they heard in their classes and from the evening speakers.

CAMPER'S CHOICE

There is free time built into our time at camp. During Camper's Choice, campers get to play games with each other, work on crafts, etc.

This time is also used for supervised swimming and hiking.

CRAFTS

Campers can choose from a number of project options during Camper's Choice. They can make things such as necklaces, bracelets, or invent their own creations using our craft supplies.

SWIMMING

Everyone has a couple of opportunities to swim during the week (weather permitting).

Campers that desire to swim must pass a simple swim test.

QUIET TIME

Campers are given the opportunity to have some time alone to pray & meditate on Scripture. This is a special practice that we hope campers will continue once they go back home.

EVENING WORSHIP

After dinner, we join again in the amphitheater for worship and to listen to a speaker.

CANTEEN/REFRESHMENTS

Each evening, campers have the chance to rest, hang out, and enjoy snacks together. All snacks and drinks are included in your camper fee.

EVENING FUN

The entire camp has fun together participating in various activities at night.

DEVO UNDER THE STARS

There's just something about getting away from the city lights and singing under the stars! This special worship time is the last thing that we do all together each day.

CABIN TIME

Each night, campers get a chance to reflect on the day with their peers in their cabin.

CAMP POLICIES

BEHAVIOR & DISCIPLINE

Regarding behavior, the Camp Koinonia staff expects our campers to:

1. Act respectfully and within basic Christian guidelines.
2. Behave in a manner that does not threaten their own safety or anyone else's (by their words or actions).

Our volunteer camp counselors will handle most of our behavior problems directly. However, upon numerous or severe discipline problems, the Camp Director will become involved. At that time, the camper is given a single warning. At the next occurrence of any problem, they will be sent home without a refund. In more severe cases, campers may be sent home without a warning. This is left to the discretion of the Camp Director. If you plan to be out of town, we will leave the child with the family or person indicated as "Other Emergency Contact" on the student registration form.

Thankfully, God continues to bless Camp Koinonia with an excellent staff and groups of campers, and therefore discipline problems are few and far between.

DRESS CODE

We depend on the parents to help their campers determine appropriately modest clothing. The dress code will be enforced by camp staff. While styles constantly change, our standards for modesty do not. Modesty is important and, because of this, we have a few rules concerning our dress code:

- A. All tops and shirts should cover the belt line (when arms are raised) and must be at least 3 fingers wide at the shoulder. No tank tops with armholes larger than 8" (when worn). No halter tops, spaghetti straps or shirts/tops that reveal cleavage. Sheer shirts must have a camp appropriate shirt worn underneath.
- B. Shorts should have AT LEAST A 4" INSEAM and skirts should be knee-length.
- C. Skin-tight clothing (spandex, yoga pants, tops, tight jeans, etc.) and/or revealing clothing are inappropriate for camp and need to be left at home.
- D. During swim time, appropriate swim wear must be worn. Guys, swim trunks must be modest length. Girls, swimsuits should be a one piece, tank-ini, or t-shirt worn over swimsuit.
- E. Clothing with offensive or inappropriate designs, as determined by Camp staff or Director, is not allowed.

Parents, be conscious of length and fit of ALL clothing. Please discuss the dress code with their camper BEFORE your camper packs and make sure they completely understand our Dress Code. It is your primary responsibility.

The Camp Director has the final say on what is appropriate and acceptable clothing at Camp and may ask a camper to change if deemed inappropriate.

PHONES AT CAMP

CAMPERS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO HAVE THEIR CELL PHONES AT CAMP KOINONIA. We recommend leaving cell phones with parents before camp begins. If in their possession, we require all campers to give their cell phones to their Counselor on Arrival Sunday for the entirety of the session. Campers' cell phones will be stored and returned on Check Out Day. We believe that campers benefit from spending time away from texting, social media, and constant connection. Campers will not have access to any phones during the session. However, if there is a legitimate need for your camper to call home, they will be allowed to do so.

CAMP POLICIES

(CONTINUED)

At Camp Koinonia, every camper will have the opportunity for a safe and uplifting camping experience. A fun-filled, spiritually charged adventure is better facilitated when campers know their boundaries. Most importantly, all campers will be treated, and in turn should treat others, in a Christ-like manner.

1. Campers will, above all else, focus on the priority of Camp K – to draw closer in relationship with the Living God and will come with an open heart and open mind to what the Lord wants to do with this week of my life.
2. Campers will embody the attitudes, actions, and heart of Christ while at Camp Koinonia.
3. I will treat my fellow campers with love and respect, lifting them up spiritually, mentally, and physically. I will not participate in any form of bullying, and I will defend others in all situations.
4. Campers will respect, submit to, and obey every member of the Camp K staff.
5. Campers will be good stewards of camp buildings and grounds.
6. Campers will not leave the camp without the permission of the Camp Director.
7. Campers are not allowed in the cabins of the opposite sex.
8. Campers must stay out of the creek in unsupervised situations (non-designated swimming times). Throwing of campers or adults into the creek at any time for any reason is not allowed.
9. During canteen/refreshments time, candy, soft drinks, and other sweets must stay in the immediate canteen vicinity (unless otherwise specified). All trash, cups, and wrappers should be placed in the proper waste receptacles.
10. Because our primary focus of camp is the spiritual growth of campers, campers will refrain from dating (or even handholding) for the duration of the session. We all have enough distractions as it is!
11. Campers should not be visited by peers while camp is in session.
12. Campers will follow the Camp K schedule and will work hard to BE ON TIME to all activities.
13. Campers will adhere to the Dress Code as described on page 4 of this handbook. A camper may be asked to change if inappropriate clothes are worn.
14. Vulgar, profane, or hurtful language or gestures will not be tolerated.
15. Possession or use of the following items at camp is prohibited: alcohol, tobacco in any form, e-cigs or vaping materials, illegal drugs and/or drug paraphernalia, cell phones, electronic games, electric guitars, radios, stereos, CD/DVD/iPod/mp3 players, fireworks, lighters, firearms, and knives. The abuse of any controlled substance, including prescriptions or over-the-counter drugs will not be tolerated. A zero-tolerance policy for this rule will be enforced and those who break it will be sent home at the parent's expense immediately and without refund.

The Camp Director has enacted these rules to ensure the best camp experience possible.

By registering and arriving at camp, every camper acknowledges they have read and understand the expectations of the Camp Koinonia staff.

MEDICAL INFO

MEDICAL STAFF & LIFEGUARDS

During each session, we have at least one medical professional on campgrounds at all times. Swim times are overseen by Red Cross Certified Lifeguards.

EMERGENCIES

If an incident occurs at camp, the staff will first attempt to contact the parent(s) and then proceed to contact the other emergency contact(s) from the camper application. If needed, any one of several Travis County hospitals, including Cedar Park Regional Medical Center, would be utilized for medical assistance.

MEDICATIONS

Prescription -- Prescription medications currently being taken are collected by our medical staff as directed by the Texas Department of Health and dispensed according to the doctor's instructions. Exceptions to this are emergency medications (i.e. inhalers, EpiPens) which students can keep with them.

Over-the-Counter -- The medical staff will be well-supplied for normal ailments. Over-the-counter medications are given to any camper who requests help with symptoms they are experiencing, unless instructed otherwise. These medications are administered per the manufacturer's instructions. If you have particular brands that you wish to send, be sure to turn them into the medical staff with the camper's name on it and they will be returned to you at the end of camp.

HEAD LICE POLICY

Self-contained communities, particularly overnight camps, are especially vulnerable to the spread of head lice. Camp has adopted the following policy in an effort to help prevent the spread of head lice during a student's time at camp.

- If live lice or nits are found on a camper, the camper will be removed from the general camper population and brought to the medical team for confirmation of the lice and/or nits.
- After confirmation, the medical team will contact the parent or emergency contact on file. Parents will be asked to pick up their camper as soon as possible. The campers will be kept from any activities that could potentially involve head-to-head contact until the parent arrives.
- The camper may return to camp ONLY if they seek treatment at an approved Lice Treatment Facility. The following clinics are the closest Lice Treatment Facilities to Camp K:

- If the camper is returning, the staff will wash their bedding and place the camper's hair care items in a Ziploc bag in the freezer overnight in an effort to prevent re-infestation.

COMMUNICATING WITH MY CAMPER

SENDING CAMPERS EMAIL

Campers can receive email during the session. Each day at lunch, mail is distributed to campers and staff. You can use our website to send emails to campers and staff. Please label all emails with the camper's name and the grade they are going into.

EMAIL GUIDELINES

We recognize that campers enjoy receiving mail from home while at camp and want to continue to allow this to be a part of the camp experience. Please follow these guidelines to help make this possible.

- Send meaningful correspondence to your camper. Send messages that are uplifting, encouraging, and beneficial to your child's experience.
- Email arriving after 9:00am on the last day of Camp may or may not be received by your camper due to Camp activities & schedule.

EMAIL GUIDELINES

Emails will be printed each day at 9:00am and campers receive them at lunch. Any emails received after 9:00am will be printed the following day.

Campers do not have access to a computer to reply to your messages. Your emails are simply for their enjoyment.

Please keep the following guidelines in mind:

- Fill out the Camper Contact Form on <http://www.camp-k.org>
- Please note your camper's first & last name in the subject line of the email.
- Please do not send pictures as a part of an email.
- Please be brief and keep it to one page.

OTHER INFO

PHONES/CAR KEYS AT CAMP

CAMPERS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO HAVE THEIR CELL PHONES OR CAR KEYS AT CAMP KOINONIA. We recommend leaving these items with parents before camp begins. If in their possession, we require all campers to give their cell phones and car keys to their Counselor for the entirety of the session. These items will be collected upon the onset of camp on *Arrival Day*. Campers' cell phones and car keys will be stored and returned on *Check Out Day*. We believe that campers benefit from spending time away from texting, social media, and constant connection. Campers will not have access to any camp phones during the session. However, please trust that if there is a legitimate need for your camper to call home, they will be allowed to do so.

EMERGENCY PHONE NUMBER

If you have an emergency or message that needs to get to your camper, call (254) 613-2121.

This phone number is to be called only in the case of a true emergency. In the event of an emergency, when you need to talk to someone at camp immediately, please call the emergency phone number. You may need to leave a message, but messages will be immediately forwarded to the Camp Director & you will receive a response very soon.

HELPFUL TIPS

CONDITIONS AT CAMP

In case you are not familiar with Central Texas in the summer, it gets HOT and can be buggy! But there are a number of ways these things can be managed and still have a great time.

Talk with your camper about ways to stay cool during their stay.

Purchase a non-breakable plastic water bottle (i.e., Nalgene bottle) to be carried throughout the day.

Send them with plenty of sunscreen (with a high SPF) & insect repellent. Remind them of how important it is that they apply these regularly. Our Counselors will also remind them daily.

Consider bringing a small fan, extension cord, and bungee cords to hang it for their sleeping area.

Consider packing a hat for your camper.

A backpack helps carry the many items (Bible, journal, pen, sunscreen, water, etc.) they will need during the day.

ACTIVITIES & HOW TO PACK

REMEMBER TO LABEL ALL OF YOUR CAMPER'S ITEMS.

Please pack their clothes ensuring that everything adheres to the Dress Code (see page 4).

It's possible that each day we will have a game or activity that will involve getting messy or wet. Here are some of our suggestions for how to pack.

TIPS FOR PACKING

- Bring up to 2 sets of clothes that can get messy or wet.
- Go to Goodwill and purchase some clothing for those messy days.
- Pack a couple of swimsuits. They can wear it under their clothes during some activities if they choose.
- *(Particularly helpful for younger campers)* Put sets of clothes in gallon baggies, labeled for each day.
- Bring clothespins to hang shirts, shorts, etc. on a clothesline near the cabin.

WHAT TO PACK

LABEL ALL YOUR THINGS

PERSONAL ITEMS

- Bible
- Twin-size sheets & blanket or Sleeping bag
- Pillow and pillowcase
- 1-2 Towels and washcloth
(for showering and swimming)
- Toiletries: toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, soap, deodorant, etc.
- Bag/Shower tote to carry
- Dirty clothes laundry bag
- Pens or pencils
- Flashlight with good batteries
- Non-breakable plastic bottle for water
(i.e., Nalgene bottle)
- Camping chair (for Journey/Big Group time)
- Small backpack
- Insect repellent (Bring plenty)
- Sunscreen with high SPF
- Necessary medications:
Prescription or Over-the-Counter

All medications must be given to our Medical Staff and must be in the original packaging with the camper's name on the label. Exceptions to this are emergency medications (i.e. inhalers, EpiPens) which campers can keep with them. Details can be found in "Medications" section on pg 6.

Please label all items.

Camp Koinonia is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen items.

LOST AND FOUND

Items left at Camp will be kept for **three (3) weeks** after your session. After that time, all unclaimed items will be donated to a local charity in Belton, TX.

CLOTHES

Please ensure all clothes adhere to the Dress Code on page 4.

- Loose fitting T-shirts, modest shirts, or blouses
- Modest shorts and/or skirts
- Socks
- Underwear
- Pajamas/Clothes for bed
- Light jacket or rain poncho
- 1-2 Swimsuits (see Dress Code)
- (Optional) Nicer clothes for evening camp picture night (i.e. some guys choose to wear a Polo shirt; some girls choose to wear a nice blouse and nicer shorts/skirt, or a knee-length dress. All clothes **MUST** abide by the Camp Dress Code (page 4).

RECOMMENDED FOOTWEAR

- Closed-toe tennis shoes
- Old pair of tennis shoes
- Flip-flops or sandals
(to serve as shower shoes)
- (Optional) Water shoes or Crocs (Note: These are not to be worn during active camp activities)

OTHER OPTIONAL ITEMS

- Sunglasses
- Hat (to protect from sun)
- Small fan
- Spiral or notepad
- Digital camera (bring at your own risk)
- Ball glove, frisbees, balls, etc.
- Inner tubes or other items for water fun
- Disposable camera

DO NOT BRING

- ✗ Bad attitudes
- ✗ Clothes that don't adhere to Dress Code – see page 4
(Certain tank tops, spaghetti straps, crop tops, short shorts, etc.)
- ✗ Electronic devices -
(including cellphones, radios, Ipods/CD or MP3 players, video game players, TVs, laptops, tablets, walkie talkies, smart watches, etc.)
- ✗ Fireworks, matches, or lighters
- ✗ Pets
- ✗ Weapons, firearms, paintball, or airsoft guns
- ✗ Bikes, skateboards, scooters, rip sticks, etc.
- ✗ Alcohol, tobacco, e-cig/vaping items, illegal substances
- ✗ Candy or food items
- ✗ Valuable or sentimental items
- ✗ Extra money

LEAVING CAMP

LEAVING CAMP EARLY

If your camper needs to leave camp during the session for any reason, please make arrangements with the camp office beforehand (preferably prior to the start of camp) so we can have him/her ready for your arrival. You will need to sign out with the Camp Secretary and leave information about your return time. Please check in with the Camp Secretary when you return. If your camper will not be returning to camp, please inform us of this when you contact us and check out with the Camp Secretary.

CHECK OUT DAY (TUESDAY) – SENIOR WEEK

Check out is from **3:30pm - 4:15pm on Tuesday at their cabin.** Keep in mind that until 3:30pm there are activities going on, so while we realize it's a small window, we ask that you not come earlier than 3:30pm.

It's important that you **do not leave until your camper is signed out.** Their luggage & other items will be in a designated area near their cabin.

CHECK OUT DAY (SATURDAY) – JUNIOR WEEK

Check out is from **3:30pm - 4:15pm on Saturday at their cabin.** Keep in mind that until 3:30pm there are activities going on, so while we realize it's a small window, we ask that you not come earlier than 3:30pm.

It's important that you **do not leave until your camper is signed out.** Their luggage & other items will be in a designated area near their cabin.

ITEMS LEFT BEHIND

Items left at Camp will be kept for three (3) weeks after your session. After that time, all unclaimed items will be donated to a local charity in Belton, TX. To inquire about lost items, email the camp office: info@camp-k.org.
